Minutes April 11, 2015

The meeting was called to order at 12:05 by President Virginia Jones.

It was moved by Lisa Jipson with a second by Joan Ishida that the minutes from the March meeting be approved as presented in the April Rosette. The motion passed.

There was not a Treasurer's Report at this time. Publishing Treasurer's Reports in the Rosette was discussed favorably. There was no correspondence. Legislative information has been forwarded as soon as it has been received by email.

Lisa Jipson and Jeannine Corder turned in four Jared Boxes; all boxes are due at our May 30 meeting.

Submission deadline for the next Rosette is May 8 and the submission deadline for the May agenda is May 15.

Dorothy Wagy moved and Carolyn Arthur offered a second that a \$100 donation to L.I.F.E. shall be sent in memory of Fred Thomas, Area Director Veronica Thomas husband. The motion passed. Lisa explained how funding is available through LIFE and the types of projects that are acceptable. LIFE is funded entirely upon donations.

Rules for accepting dues were discussed. Currently they are \$85.00 and they will be \$90.00 June 1.

Scanning old documents was discussed. Chi State Headquarters will be contacted to determine what has to be saved. Dorothy Wagy moved and Carolyn Arthur seconded that records/documents will be scanned for \$10 and hour at the Porterville Sheltered Workshop. It was agreed that the topic could be revisited if a member or responsible party agreed to scan the documents. The boxes of documents will be available for review at the June planning meeting, then final plans will be executed.

It is recommended that members sign up with iContact to receive up to date information, ideas for projects and programs through the Chi State Website.

Saturday, June 20 at 11:00 there will be a planning meeting for the 2015-2016 year. Members will assume chairmanship and responsibility for programs next year; as there is no Program Vice President. We are required to present four programs each year.
